Grades 2nd – 5th

Will create a 9”x12” poster using this year’s theme of “What Does Freedom Mean To Me.”

Grades 6th – 12th

Will write an essay using this year’s theme “What Does Freedom Mean To Me.”

(6th 200 words, 7th & 8th 300 words, 9th & 10th 400 words, 11th & 12th 500 words)

Pick up the instructions and materials you need at the Reference Desk at the library. Contest begins on April 1st 2020. All entries MUST be returned to the Reference Desk by Thursday April 30th 2020. There will be a prize awarded for each grade. The prize will be a \$25.00 U.S. Savings Bond. Prizes will be awarded at the annual Memorial Day Remembrance Ceremony, Monday, May 25th, 2020, in Glenwood. Group winners will be entered into the State and National AMVETS Americanism Contest.
