Whether you read magazines and newspapers, large print mysteries, or graphic novels, the library has the genres and formats that will allow you take the library wherever you go.

We'll reward you for both reaching your weekly reading goals AND by attending library programming, so the more you participate, the greater your chances to win!

Instructions (All ages)

- Pick up a reading log and each week, mark an X on each book image indicating that you have read **at least 20 minutes each day**.
- Each week, bring your log sheet confirming that you have read at least **100 minutes (5 marked books)** to the Reference Desk to obtain your prize.
- You will earn 1 raffle ticket each week for meeting your reading goal (100 minutes).
- You will also earn 1 raffle ticket for each program you attend. Make sure to ask staff for your raffle ticket **BEFORE** you leave the library. We cannot issue raffle tickets for the previous week's program attendance.
- You may turn in weekly reading minutes from previous weeks, but you may not read ahead i.e. you can turn in week 1 reading totals in week 3, but you cannot turn in week 7 reading totals in week 1.

Prizes

- Reach your weekly goal (100 minutes) to earn a weekly prize and 1 raffle ticket.
- Raffle tickets earned during weekly reading and program attendance are entered into the Summer Reading grand prize drawing that will take place in August.




